Bursa (figs. 39, 40) comparatively small, not over twice as wide as the maximum thickness of the body when both lobes are spread out. Posterior end of the body truncate, projecting backward between the wings of the bursa, ventrally forming two rounded protuberances separated by a shallow median groove. The paired rays are of nearly equal thickness, except the latero-ventral ray, which is slightly thicker than the others. Measured on the periphery of the bursa, the distance between the anterior end of the bursa and the tips of the ventral rays (v. v., l. v., figs. 39, 40) is about equal to that between the latter and the tip of the externo-dorsal ray (e. d., figs. 39, 40).
