The pioneers of North Dakota had been exploited by land speculators, transportation monopolists, loan sharks and elevator and milling combines practically since the earliest settlement of the State. Partial victories against railway monopolies had been secured, in common with other states, nearly twenty years earlier, resulting in the passage of the Sherman Anti-Trust law, which was followed by other acts of Congress aiming to prevent railway discrimination and to curtail extortionate transportation charges.
